Semester periods, academic year 2016/17

For the academic year 2016/2017 the following semester periods apply: Autumn semester 2016 starts on Monday 29 August 2016 and ends on Sunday 15 January 2017. Spring semester 2017 starts on Monday 16 January and ends on Sunday 4 June.

Exceptions

Law degree programme.

Newly admitted students for semester 1 will have their first day on the programme on the Wednesday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester. For the academic year 2016/2017 this will be Wednesday 24 August 2017.

Master's programme in Environmental Management and Policy.

Semester 1, which is taught at a 50% rate of study, will commence in the week starting 10 October 2016 and end in the week concluding on 18 June 2017. The rest of the programme is taught full time, and semester 2 will begin in the week starting 15 August 2016 and end in the last week of December of the same year. Semester 3 will commence the week starting 2 January 2017 and end on the week concluding on 21 May 2017. Finally, semester 4 will commence on the week starting on 22 May 2017 and end on the week concluding on 8 October 2017.

Courses SOAP02 Basic Course in Psychodynamic Psychotherapy, SOAP04

Basic Course in Cognitive and Behavioural Psychotherapy, SOAP05 Basic Systems-Theoretical and Interactionist Psychotherapy Training in Family Therapy, SOAN45

Supervision Methodology in Social Work, and SOAN34 Social Work: Assessment and Decision-Making in Professional Social Work.

The courses will commence on the Thursday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

All Master's programmes (60/120 credits) at the School of Economics and Management (Globalisation Brands and Consumption, Managing People, Knowledge and Change, Corporate and Financial Management, Accounting and Management Control, International Marketing and Brand Management, Entrepreneurship, Information Systems, European and International Tax Law, Economic Demography, Economic Growth, Innovation and Spatial Dynamics, Economic History, Economics 120 credits, Finance 120 credits, Economics 60 credits, Finance 60 credits, International Economics with a focus on China).

Newly admitted students will commence their studies on the Wednesday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

Medical degree programme and Master's programme in Public Health.

The spring semester will commence one week after the last day of the autumn semester and run for 20 weeks.

Bachelor's programme in Behavioural Science and Bachelor's programme in Human Resource Development and Labour Relations.

Newly admitted students to the first semester of the programmes will commence their studies on the Thursday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

Master's programme in Social Sciences specialising in Psychology and Political Science, Master's programme in European Affairs, and Master's programme in Welfare Policies and Management.

Newly admitted students to the first semester of the programmes will commence their studies on the Friday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

MSc in Engineering programmes and Master's programme in Fire Safety Engineering.

Newly admitted students to the first semester of the programmes will commence their studies on the Monday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

Foundation year programme in Engineering and Bachelor's programmes in Engineering.

Newly admitted students to the first semester of the programmes will commence their studies on the Wednesday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

Master's programme in Environmental Studies and Sustainability Science (LUMES).

Newly admitted students to the first semester of the programme will commence their studies on the Wednesday of the week immediately preceding the regular start date of the semester.

Course BIOB03 Biology, Floristics.

Course ends on 11 June 2017.
